An Ordinance to Open the Streets within the Borough

be it enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Northumberland and its successors, enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the first day of May A. D. One Thousand eight hundred and thirty, every Lane, Street and Alley within the limits of this Borough shall be opened for the use of the Inhabitants thereof, and it shall be the duty of the Supervisors of the Streets and Roads of the Borough, to open the same, and they shall be paid for labor and expences in so doing out of the Treasury of the Borough, Provided that any ^{person} having any Street Lane or Alley, as aforesaid enclosed, may continue to hold the same inclosed, by his paying annually hereafter, before the first day of May in each year into the Treasury of the Borough, the sum of One Dollar for every section of any Street, sixty feet wide by Two Hundred and forty feet in length so by him inclosed, within the limits of the Town of Northumberland as laid out by Lowden and Patterson and Reuben Morris, and the sum of Twenty five Cents for every section of any Street of the same length and breadth within the plan of the lot near to the said Town, so far as the said lot may be included within the limits of said Borough and in the proportions aforesaid for a greater or less quantity of any Street, Lane, or Alley, so by any person inclosed within either of the limits aforesaid, and the Supervisor shall desist from opening any of the Streets, Lanes, or Alleys, included as aforesaid upon the receipt of the Treasurer of the Borough, for the sums charged upon them by this Ordinance being to them produced,

AN ORDINANCE TO OPEN THE STREETS WITHIN THE BOROUGH

Be it enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Northumberland and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the first day of May, A.D. One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty every lane, street, and alley within the limits of this Borough shall be opened for the use of the inhabitants thereof, and it shall be the duty of the supervisor of the streets and roads of the Borough, to open the same, and they shall be paid for labor and expenses in so doing out of the Treasury of the Borough, Provided that any person having any street, lane or alley, as aforesaid, inclosed, may continue to hold the same inclosed, by his paying annually hereafter, before the first day of May in each year into the Treasury of the Borough, the sum of One Dollar for every section of any street, sixty feet wide by four hundred and forty feet in length, so by him inclosed, within the limits of the Town of Northumberland as laid out by Lowden and Patterson and Reuben Haines, and the sum of Twenty-five cents for every section of any street of the same length and breadth within the plan of the out lots near to the said town, so far as the said out lots may be included within the limits of said Borough and in the proportions aforesaid for a greater or less quantity of any street, lane, or alley, so by any person inclosed within either of the limits aforesaid, and the supervisor shall desist from opening any of the streets, lanes, or alleys, included as aforesaid upon the receipt of the Treasurer of the Borough for the sums charged upon them by this act being to them produced.
